### A modern city built on the sands of time

Enrich your stopover with a tour of Amman. Upon arrival at Queen Alia International Airport, you will be warmly welcomed by a representative at Royal Jordanian's transit desk, who will guide you on your tour through Amman. The capital of Jordan, Amman is a fascinating city of contrasts with a unique blend of old and new, ideally situated on a hilly area between the desert and the fertile Jordan Valley.

The downtown area is uniquely old and traditional, with smaller businesses producing and selling everything from fabulous jewelry to everyday household items.

Start your tour of Amman by visiting the Citadel (Jabal Al-Qala'a) for an unparalleled view of the downtown area. The Citadel sits on the highest hill in Amman and is the sight of ancient Rabath-Ammon. Artifacts dating back from the Bronze Age show that the hill was a fortress and agora.

Then you can pass by the archeological museum, the stunning Roman Theater and the museum of traditional culture for an overview of unique Jordanian heritage. The Roman Theatre was built during the reign of Antonius Pius (138-161 CE) and could seat about 6,000 people.

On the way back, you'll pass by the majestic King Abdullah Mosque with its radiant blue dome.

During the tour, you will have a delicious lunch at a local restaurant, and then proceed to the airport for final departure.

Embrace the beauty of the Dead Sea while enjoying a swim at a private Beach at the Dead Sea Spa Hotel, followed by a delicious lunch.

You will then have the chance to visit the Panoramic Complex which offers some breathtaking views, especially on a crisp day in winter when the Judaea Mountains across the water seem just an arm's stretch away.

Your tour begins in Jerash, the former site of the Greco-Roman city of Gerasa. One of the most well preserved Roman sites in the world, the site contains countless features and remarkable structures standing after centuries. Referred to as Antioch on the Golden River, the city was founded by Alexander the Great or her general Ptolemy, creating a settlement for aged Macedonian soldiers.

Jerash lies on a plain surrounded by hilly wooded areas and fertile basins. Conquered by General Pompey in 63 BC, it came under Roman rule and was one of the ten great Roman cities of the Decapolis League.

After that you can enjoy a delicious lunch at a local restaurant, and then head back to the airport for departure.

## Shobak Castle Tour

### 8-Hour Transit

### Montreal (Crusader Castle)

Add a sense of adventure to your stopover with an enchanting tour of Shobak Castle. Perched in a wild, remote landscape, Shobak Castle wins over even the most castle-weary, with its amazingly captivating architecture. Formerly called Mons Realis (Mont Real, or Montreal – the Royal Mountain), it was built by the crusader King Baldwin I in 1115.

Led by the castle's caretaker, and with the help of a torch, you will be shown around the castle's many dark corners. As you climb up from the entrance, explore the wells to your left. Soon after passing these, you'll be able to see the reconstructed church, one of two in the castle, down to your left.

Enjoy an interesting show held at the castle 5 times a day, 6 days a week. The show is a re-enactment of the Ayyoubi era, featuring a battle between the Ayyoubi's and warriors dressed completely in black.

Show timings:

Saturday - Monday - Wednesday: 9 am, 10 am, 11 am, 12 pm, 1:30 pm

Sunday - Tuesday – Thursday: 10 am, 11 am, 12 pm, 1:30 pm

One of the most well preserved Roman sites in the world, the site contains countless features and remarkable structures standing after centuries. Referred to as Antioch on the Golden River, the city was founded by Alexander the Great or her general Ptolemy, creating a settlement for aged Macedonian soldiers. After that, you will have a delicious lunch before heading to the Ajloun Castle, a fortress built by Izz al-Din Usama, a commander and nephew of Salah ad-Din al-Ayyubi (Saladin), in AD 1184-1185. The fortress is considered one of the very few built to protect the country against Crusader attacks from Karak in the South and Bisan in the West. After that you will proceed to the airport for final departure.

## Desert Castles Tour

Trek through golden deserts on your way to visit the desert castles and fortresses in the east of Jordan.

Enrich your stopover in Jordan and start your tour at the Qasr Mshatta, about 30km (20m) southeast of Amman, which is the ruin of an Umayyad winter palace (743-744).

Next you will head to The Qasr Kharana, about 60km (38m) east of Amman, which is one of the best-known of the desert castles. It is believed to have been built sometime before the early 8th century.

Then you will continue your adventure by visiting The Qasr Amra, about 85km (53m) east of Amman, which is the most famous of the desert castles located in present-day eastern Jordan, and was built early in the 8th century. Your tour comes to an end at The Al Azraq Castle, a large fortress in eastern Jordan is named after a nearby oasis.

You will have a delicious lunch at a local restaurant before heading back to the airport for departure.

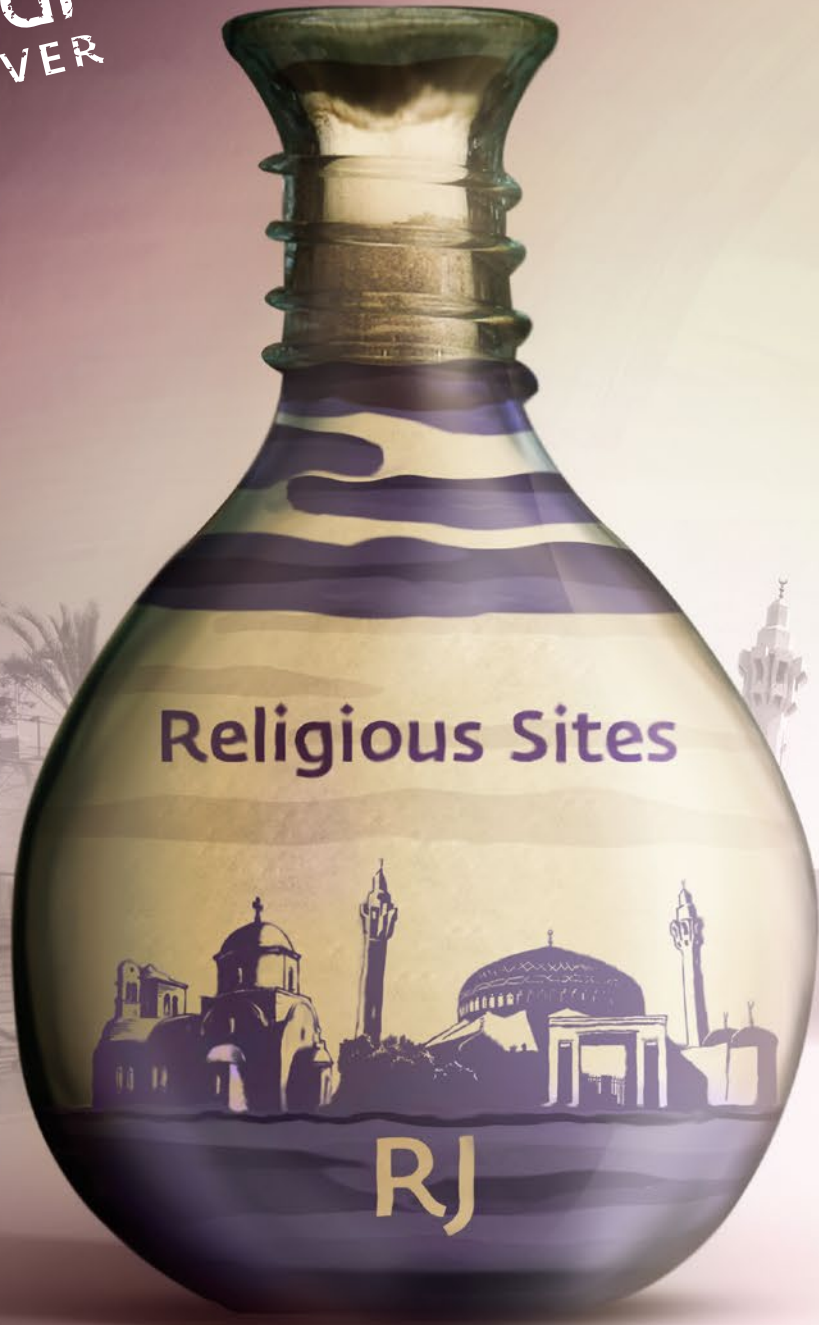

Cave of Seven Sleepers

Seven kilometers east of Amman, visit the Raqem cave, which was discovered by Jordanian archeologist Rafeeq Wafa Al Dajani in 1963. The great skeletons of the cavemen, described in the Holy Quran, can be seen through a small glass opening. The site encompasses two old mosques - the first lying directly on the top of the cave, while the other exists in its front yard.

## Umm Al Rasas and Mkawer Tour

### 8-Hour Transit

After a private airport pickup, you will head to Umm al Rasas - named by UNISCO as one of the World Heritage sites - and mentioned in the Old and New Testaments, and which the Romans fortified and the local Christians were still embellishing with Byzantine-style mosaics well over one hundred years after the beginning of Muslim rule.

The rectangular walled city is mostly in ruins but still includes several buildings, as well as four churches and beautiful stone arches. The main attraction lays within the Church of St. Stephen, which contains a very large, perfectly preserved mosaic floor dating back to 718.

After finishing your tour of Umm Al Rasas, you will head to Mkawer, with its stunning panoramic views of the surrounding countryside, the Dead Sea, and the West Bank. On a clear night you can easily make out the lights of Al-Quds (Jerusalem) and Ariha (Jericho).

You will then enjoy lunch at a local restaurant, before heading back to the airport for final departure.

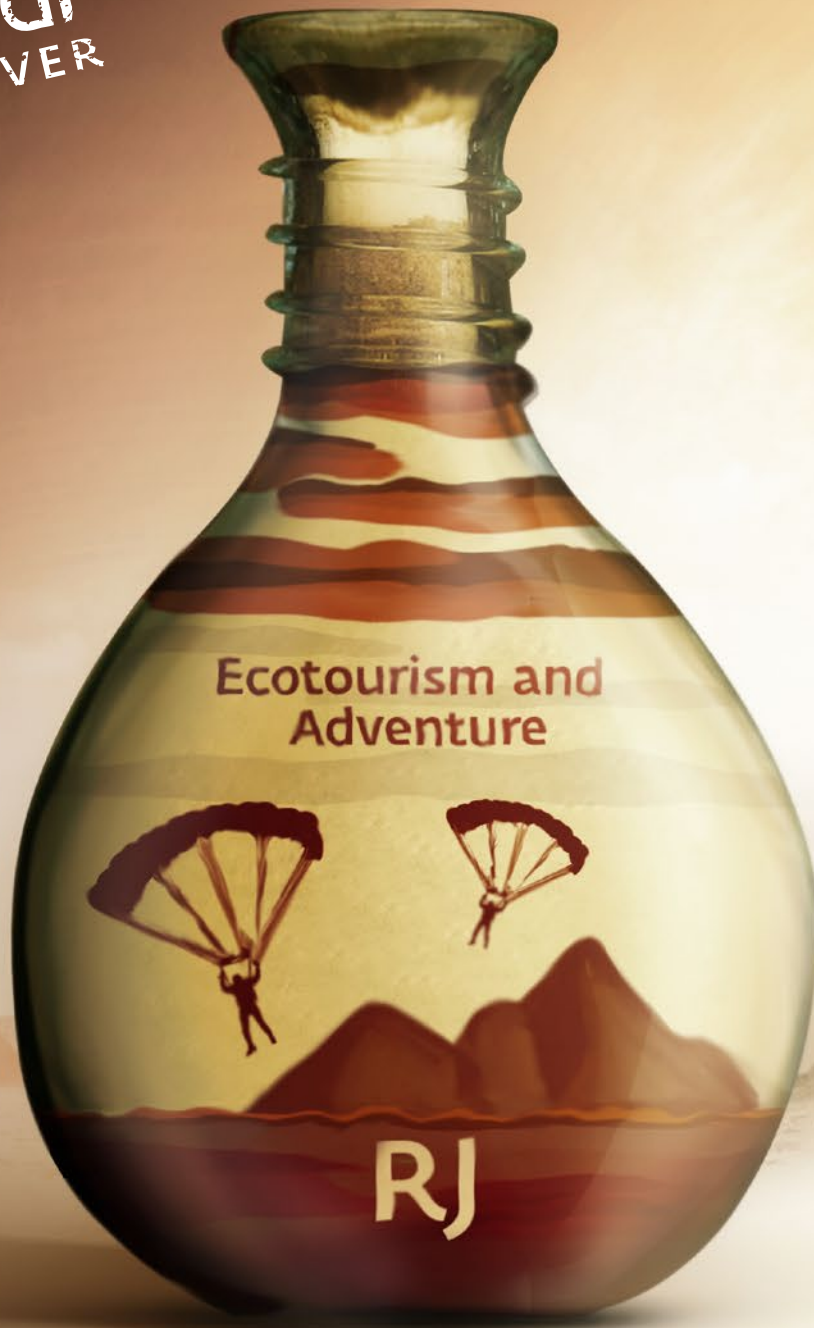

After marveling at the beauty of Petra, head to Wadi Rum, also known as 'The Valley of the Moon'. This is the place where Prince Faisal Bin Hussein and T.E. Lawrence were headquartered during the Arab Revolt against the Ottomans in World War I, and their exploits are intrinsically woven into the history of this amazing area. Enjoy the thrill of a 2-hour safari jeep ride in Wadi Rum, then proceed to the airport for final departure.

Then you can pass by the archeological museum, the stunning Roman Theater and the museum of traditional culture for an overview of unique Jordanian heritage. The Roman Theatre was built during the reign of Antonius Pius (138-161 CE) and could seat about 6,000 people. Afterwards, you'll pass by the majestic King Abdullah Mosque with its radiant blue dome.

Next, you will visit the Jordan Museum which is located in the dynamic new downtown area of Ras al-'Ayn. Presenting Jordanian history and cultural heritage in a series of beautifully designed galleries, the Jordan Museum serves as a comprehensive national centre for learning and knowledge that reflects Jordan's history and culture, and presents in an engaging yet educational way the Kingdom's history, antiquity and heritage as part of its ongoing story.

Later on, you will head to the city of Madaba, where you will spend a magical night.

Starting your tour of Madaba with a visit to the Archeological Museum, you will experience antiquity like no other. Then you will pass by the Archeological Park, which the Romans created as a typical provincial town, with colonnaded streets, fine temples, large water cisterns and a town wall.

Marvel at the beauty of the Church of St. George, home of the oldest mosaic map known to exist. The first mosaics were discovered purely by chance during the building of the new permanent dwellings using squared-up stones from the old monuments.

# Jordan at a Glance

## Getting Around

While street addresses are rarely used in Jordan, most places of interest are well known nationwide. And though the city itself is built on seven hills, getting around is simple with Amman's huge network of yellow taxis.

Whether you're exploring on foot or cruising through the streets, you can always feel comfortable asking a passerby for directions – most Jordanians are more than happy to help.

## Attire

Jordan is a Muslim country, although freedom of religion is protected and respected.

With a mixture of eastern and western influence, Jordan has a healthy balance of openness versus conservatism, with rural areas being more conservative than large cities. Therefore, dressing with your destination in mind is highly recommended.

## Language

Arabic is the official language of Jordan, but English is taught in most schools and is widely spoken and understood. Plus, being in Jordan is a wonderful opportunity to pick up a few words of Arabic. Just say 'marhaba' (hello) with a smile and you're sure to meet new friends wherever you go.

## Cuisine

Delicious food is an important part of any travel experience, and one that will immensely enrich your stay in Jordan. With a wealth of traditional cuisine, the most famous are mansaf (rice with chicken or lamb and cooked yoghurt), hummus and falafel (made from chickpeas, eaten for breakfast). With delicious local foods available around the Kingdom, you will also find a wide mixture of international restaurants, offering everything from Italian and Chinese to American diners and so much more.

## Currency

The Jordanian Dinar (JD) is the official currency of the Kingdom, divided into 100 piasters and 1,000 fils. Currently, there are notes ranging in denomination from JD 1 to JD 50.

The dinar is pegged to the US dollar and can be reliably exchanged at a rate of USD 1 – JOD 0.7.

## **Ramadan**

Each year, Muslims all throughout Jordan spend the ninth month of the Islamic calendar observing a community-wide fast, from sunrise to sunset. The annual fast of Ramadan is considered one of the five pillars of Islam, and requires Muslims who are physically able to fast the entire month.

Evenings are usually spent enjoying family time, reading from the Quran and spiritual reflection and prayer.

Citizens of most countries are allowed to enter Jordan without a preapproved visa. However, every traveler should check with their local embassy to confirm visa requirements.

A single-entry visa (valid for two months) can be purchased upon arrival for JD 40 (approximately USD 56).

## **Healthcare**

Concentrated in Amman, Jordan has one of the most advanced medical systems in the region. World Bank recently ranked it as among the top five healthcare systems worldwide. It is also the number one medical tourism destination in the Middle East and North Africa.

## **Climate**

Jordan has a hot, dry climate characterized by long, dry summers and short, cool winters. The weather is a blend of the dry climates of the Arabian Peninsula and the moderate Mediterranean.
